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

For water activities like surfing, swimming, and jet-skiing, a GoPro is, frankly, the only way to go. The palmsized GoPro 7 is fully waterproof and built with best-in-class HyperSmooth stabilization technology—so even if the user is getting knocked around, photo and video footage will remain steady and crystal-clear. "I use it any time I'm doing anything in the water—snorkeling or looking for whale sharks or gray whales especially," says Wes. The latest model is built with an intuitive touchscreen display that mimics smartphone screens, but it can also be controlled hands-free using 16 built-in voice controls.
